

Just wanted to let you know that Beacon is making 30+ deliveries of furniture to people in need in our area each month by delivering on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month. We are at this time totally out of mattresses and box springs (twin, full, queen and king). This week's deliveries have depleted all of our kitchen tables and chairs to go with them. We are also totally out of dressers, chests of drawers, end tables and coffee tables. We have a pretty good number of couches and living room chairs (we can always use them however!) but just about out of recliners.

If you have any gently used furniture items as listed above, please remember to contact Beacon at 618-222-8824 and we will take your information to then schedule a pickup on the 1st or 3rd Saturday of the month. Please tell your friends about us too. You cannot imagine the joy we see on people's faces when we arrive with a gently used couch or living room chair for them to relax on or the joy in the faces of the children who will now have a mattress to sleep on instead of sleeping on the floor, or the family that is thrilled to now have a kitchen table to sit down at for their meals. The good thing about giving your gently used



furniture items to Beacon as opposed to other organizations is that they will, in turn, sell them to people. Beacon gives these items free of charge, and with the help of all of our awesome volunteers from Union United Methodist Church who handles the first Saturday of the month and the volunteers from Cornerstone Christian Church who handles the third Saturday of the month, we are able to bring some happiness to the people receiving your donated items.

Thank you for keeping us on your radar when you are cleaning out and getting rid of your no longer wanted furniture items. God is Good -- ALL THE TIME!
