

The Reverend Malcolm Himschoot serves the United Church of Christ as the Minister for Ministerial Calls and Transitions on the MESA Team for Ministerial Excellence, Support, and Authorization. As of 2019 he has seven years of continuity in this position: designing infra-structure for Search and Call, and supporting UCC conference staff in their work with pastoral transitions in local churches. Web portals within his responsibility include *UCC Ministry Opportunities* and the

Profiles and Snapshot Database. His research and writings promote system transparency, geographic mobility, and overcoming bias, and feature the 2018-produced short film series: "Stretching Beyond." With the MESA Team, Himschoot has co-led events including Authorizing Ministry for the 21st Century. He serves as Vice President of the Board for the ecumenical Interim Ministry Network.

Himschoot has been a nationally-recognized speaker on the trans/gender education circuit since 2004, when the United Church of Christ produced Call Me Malcolm, a documentary feature film. His essays and articles have appeared in Prism: A Theological Forum for the United Church of Christ, in Sacred Spaces: E-Journal of the American Association of Pastoral Counselors, and in several anthologies by Wilgefortis Press. By training an urban pastor with Spanish as a second language, Himschoot's current volunteer work includes activism toward public health and economic justice, re-investing in Cleveland and organizing with Showing Up for Racial Justice - Northeast Ohio.

Originally from Colorado, Himschoot earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Amherst College, a Master of Divinity from Iliff School of Theology, and is presently working on a Doctorate of Ministry from the Methodist Theological School in Ohio. In addition to keynote lectures on spirituality and vocation, Himschoot has taught graduate courses in UCC History, Polity, and Theology.
