And finally, Greg Seaman our own Eden Seminary student was honored as well. It was a special service for special people! Afterwards we had a chance to fellowship in the Activity Center and feast on treats prepared by the Women's Guild. What a wonderful way to honor our past!! The icing on the cake was the four thousand dollars that was donated to the Pastor Gus Kuether Leadership Development Fund!

And while we celebrate the past, we look with eager anticipation to the future. Pastor Michelle Torigian will be here on July 2nd with her first service on July 8th. We are busy getting ready to begin our next chapter and of course we want to be clean and fresh for her arrival. 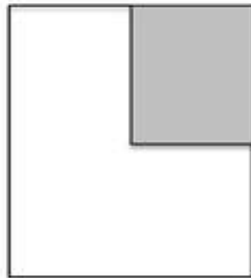
