#### Adopting an "All of Us" Perspective

Every two years the denomination comes together at General Synod to reflect and vote on issues, reconnect with the larger church, and celebrate milestones. I have attended the past six Synods and believe attending is part of my calling to connect and grow with the larger church.

As I see every two years, the entire denomination does not agree on everything. Some issues on which the delegates will vote are extremely divisive. Yet, at the end of the day, we understand that we are one Church.

When I wrote the closing worship a few years ago, part of my goal was to have a service in which we all come together again before departing. Knowing that people spoke on various sides of the issues presented, we still valued our time of worship together. This is because of our covenant with one another.

The denomination is built on the idea of covenant. We understand that churches and individuals are autonomous from one another. Yet because of the concept of the Body of Christ, we need one another despite differences. We recognize this connection to the Body of Christ - our covenant - will sustain us through debates and difficult discussions.

And we try to embrace this concept here at St. Paul UCC. There are spaces within this church for people who think differently about salvation and about the Trinity. There are spaces within this church for people who enjoy cooking and those who enjoy crafting. We have spaces within this church for people who want to serve on our Mission Board and people who want to serve our Building and Property Board. No two people are alike, and we celebrate one another's gifts and honor differing respectful perspectives.

So often, we choose an "us versus them" mentality. Instead, we are called by God to choose an

"all of us" philosophy: that no matter how different we are in our looks, our gifts, or our perspective, we are welcome here.

In what ways do each of us need to shed an "us versus them" perspective? In what ways do we, as a church, need to work on incorporating an "all of us" philosophy? What might it take for us to challenge ourselves to understand another's story in order to build a world of love? What might it take for us to continue to build relationships within this church?

When I reflect on the concept of covenant and being one Body of Christ, I reach for the lyrics of the song "One" by U2: "We're one, but we're not the same; We get to carry each other."

We, as congregants of St. Paul UCC and as members of the United Church of Christ denomination, are one. We are not the same. But it is our call to care for one another and connect, as we can, to another part of the Church.

  - if we know that we'll have more than 25 riders, we might be able to get our own bus
- \*Drop off is at the corner of Clark & Broadway near Gates 5 & 6
- \*The last bus leaves stadium -Clark Street between Broadway & 4<sup>th</sup>, 45 minutes after game ends


## Rally Day




