ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING LITURGY

One: We come to the third week of the season of Advent and gather around a wreath to light candles. The wreath reminds us of the circle of our human community and the lights illuminate the many ways in which we bring ourselves to the Incarnation, God's longed-for presence among us — human and holy,

Emmanuel — God with us and God coming to us.

Scripture (Isaiah 9:2-3a)

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy.

We light the first purple candle for the Christmas story that shines hope on our lives.

We light the second candle to shine on the places that bring us peace, including this church, and the places and people that need peace this day.

We light the pink candle to celebrate the generosity and festivity of this season and to hold in tenderness and care feelings of loss and loneliness.

Unison Prayer

Emmanuel, we celebrate the true joy in so many of our human customs of this season and consecrate them to vou. We acknowledge the stress that expectations put upon some of us. We hold tenderly the sadness and depression that longer nights, commercial demands, memories of loss, or simple loneliness bring. Transform the joy that each of us finds into a gift of kindness. Amen.



THE BYLAW REVISIONS ARE ALMOST COMPLETE!

Your Bylaw Committee has been hard at work these past few months. Our task is to carefully revise our present bylaws in an effort to make them more efficient and flexible.

Some of the concepts we will be recommending will be quite different from the way we presently do business and govern ourselves. But we hope you will agree that the suggested changes will move us into the future with less cumbersome requirements.

Here's what you need to know about the timeline:

Sunday, December 8 immediately following the service at the Annual Congregational Budget Meeting, we will be asking the Congregation for permission to postpone the annual election until the Annual Meeting on February 8.

<u>Sunday, December 22</u> the proposed Bylaw revisions will be available for you to read.

Sunday, January 5 immediately following the service, an informal meeting for Q & A will be held in the sanctuary

Sunday, January 12 immediately following the service, a Special Bylaw Meeting will be held in the sanctuary to vote on the proposed Bylaws.

Sunday, February 9 immediately following the service, elections will be held as part of the Annual Meeting agenda.




Hello Social Justice Book Group!





History with Henke A hint of St. Paul history each week

Jan 18, 1861 - A counterfeit \$5 bill and \$1.40 was the cash balance of the church.

Jan 1864 - The Ladies Aid, then known as the Frauen-Verein was organized by Rev. Graf. This was St. Paul's oldest auxiliary organization. (This organization was the forerunner of Women's Day Fellowship.)

Jan 1864 - The Ladies Aid organized St. Paul's first Sunday School.
