


+BENEDICTION







History with Henke *A hint of St. Paul history each week*

February 7, 1862 - The congregation decided to give a dance a City Park to raise money for the new church. The dance was to be given on Washington's birthday.

February 8, 1868 - The congregation decided to build a school house and parsonage on the lot adjoining the church. (This is the area next to Heritage Hall where the playground is now located.) The lot was purchased for \$200.
