#### Pastor's Message - 1440 Extra Minutes

What will you do with the additional 1440 minutes that we have at the end of this month?

I've asked myself this prior to previous Leap Days. As this year the Day of Discipleship will be held on February 29, most of the day is already claimed. I hope many of you will join me on that day to listen to speakers on the value of mental health and the church.

Maybe your Leap Day plans include a special visit from a family member or friend. Or maybe you will be on an exotic trip somewhere - either to a tropical location or maybe somewhere not so far from here.

According to a daring Irish tradition, Leap Day is the time for women to propose. (Of course, any time is appropriate for a woman to propose to her significant other.) Will your Leap Day be full of risk-taking?

It's fascinating to think about having an extra day plugged into our usual calendar. Will we take the day for granted or embrace the beauty of life on this special date?

Unfortunately, most of us waste too much time or prioritize our time in unhealthy ways. Instead of sabbath and spending time with loved ones, we focus too much on busywork. The Psalmist gives us this prayer of assistance: "Teach us to number our days so we can have a wise heart" (Psalm 90:12 CEB). We pray that we can appreciate the time we have, spending each moment constructively - whether it be resting on a sabbath, laughing with loved ones on a special evening, or working hard on a Tuesday afternoon. We pray that the gift of time is used to live into God's intentions for our world, loving our God and neighbors with our whole hearts.

Besides the Day of Discipleship, I'm not sure what my February 29 might look like at this point. There could be a proposal (since it's only fair that I propose back to Aaron). I might meet up with friends for dinner or attend a fundraising event. However the day begins to form for all of us, may we seek the presence and intentions for God, and let us Carpe Diem (seize the day) whether it be February 29 or any other day this year!
