Pastor's Message The Church Is Alive!

This is a season when the church has had to embrace the creativity of God! Our staff has been working hard. For those of you who may be listening on the radio - we are recording worship from each of our homes. Rick Haar and Tina edit the videos, and Tina continues to work on the bulletin from her home computer. Neil Holliday updates the website from his home as well. Stephenie splits her time between her home office and the church office, collecting the mail from the post office twice per week. Craig and the Christian Education team are crafting our first ever Virtual VBS. And Pat and Kyle are doing what they can to keep the building in wonderful shape, preparing it for the time when we can gather safely again.

Through the final weeks of the school year, Rachel and the MDO teachers continued to update families with enriching activities for their students. A few teachers even used Zoom to reach out to their students.

Our choir has been recording each of their separate parts from their homes as well. Bill has been directing through Zoom. Bill also records the hymns from his home, then sends them to John so that he can lead the hymn through his voice.

We've had many of our congregants active in worship as well. They've sent in photos for our various worship services - like pictures of them holding drawings of palms on Palm Sunday and photos of how they've been seeing God in this season. We've had congregants and confirmands read scripture for worship. They will record their own separate videos at home and then send us the videos for us to edit together.

Many of our teams are meeting as well. I mentioned a few times already something called "Zoom." Just like conference calls on phones in the past, Zoom is a computer application that allows everyone to see each other's faces and hear each other's voices during meetings. We've had staff meetings, semi-weekly meetings with the worship staff to ensure we are clear with our vision for worship each week, MDO teacher meetings, executive council and church council meetings online in April and May, Christian education meetings to discuss our Virtual VBS this year, finance team meetings, and youth group virtual gatherings. Twice every week I hold Zoom fellowship hours - 5pm on Wednesdays and 10am on Sundays.

And most days of the week, I'm trying to reach out by a short video on Facebook Live. Whether it's a prayer, scripture, or a poem, I want to assure those who are watching that "we are here."

I've seen how God uses each of our gifts and new technology to spread the good news of hope, grace, and love to our expanding world. Some are watching our services on Facebook Live from different parts of our country (and Canada too)! We are expanding the ways we are church. Through the wonders of all sorts of technology, we are widening our reach.

And of course, through phone calls and notes, we are able to reach our congregants of all ages and generations, making sure that we connect with each of you during this time. Thank you to our With You Team for continuing to make phone calls during this season! I have been trying to reach as many of you as possible through phone conversations. If you need a conversation and I haven't yet reached you, please reach out to me anytime.

This has been a time of learning and growth for each of us. Thank you to everyone who continues to stretch their comfort levels of using the internet and technology. Thank you to the staff who has been extremely flexible and willing to try new things to keep connected. And thank you to everyone who has given treasures, talents, and time during the past two and a half months.

If you would like to find ways to get connected to the internet and our online gatherings, please contact me. We have volunteers who would love to help you learn more about these means of connection.

Just like the church was alive after the earthly ministry of Jesus as the Holy Spirit brought gifts, wisdom, and strength to the apostles, we too are a church that is alive! Like many other congregations, we have learned new ways to be church. And when the time comes for us to regather together again, we will be stronger for the new gifts we've embraced from the Holy Spirit.



Dear St. Paul Friends,

Since the middle of March, most of us have been primarily staying close to home due to the COVID-19 pandemic. For some of you, this season has been trying for your spirits. Like many in Scriptures, all of us in one way or another feel like we have been in exile as well.

As our communities begin to slowly open, many may be wondering how St. Paul UCC may be visioning a building reopening plan in the coming weeks or months. So far, our Regathering Team has met virtually on two occasions. Mimi Llamas and Dave Hoffmann are the co-chairs of the team. Others who are part of the team include Pastor Michelle, Wayne Caughman (council president), Jan Friedrich, Patrick Kinney, Dana Rosenzweig, Craig Bielke, Dr. Bill Wade, John Posth, Stephenie Bauza, Tina LakeHopper, and Rachel Budko.

Our team has been reading many articles regarding the safety of churches in the time of COVID-19. We are examining the recommendations of the Illinois South Conference as well as other thorough documents on the safety of worship, keeping in mind the guidelines of the region/state and the data from the Greater St. Louis Metropolitan Area and the Metro East.

Many of the articles that we have read recognize that worship services are considered some of the highest risk situations, and the risk increases with singing and being indoors. Finding solutions on how to hold meaningful worship while still keeping all attending safe is not a light task. Yet deep practical and theological conversations emerge from our meetings. We know that worship may seem quite different when we regather in person, but through gradual steps, we are seeing concrete plans taking shape. Our goal is to craft a solid plan before creating a definitive timetable, including the best times and ways to gather in person for meetings and other events.

There is much we still do not know about the COVID-19 as it is a novel, or new, virus to humans. Acknowledging this as part of the process means trial and error as we make progress, taking steps forward and maybe a few back or sideways, knowing that we are still moving in the direction of being together. We know that God's grace is with us in this process.

In the meantime, we continue to hold worship in a variety of platforms. Not only can you listen to worship on Jubilee 690 AM on Sundays at 9am and 9pm, but you can also watch the services on our Facebook page https://www.facebook.com/stpauluccbelleville/ as well as on our website StPaulUCC.org. You can participate in Zoom Fellowship Time on Wednesdays at 5pm or Sundays at 10am, and most days, Pastor Michelle connects with congregants on Facebook Live. Hello from Quarantine!

Hope all are well and managing to maneuver this crazy time! Just wanted to let you all know that the church is still there, and running smoothly, it is just absent of all of the normal staff and your familiar faces around!

We have had Pat Kinney and Kyle at the church doing a good deal of things that don't require them being next to each other and respecting proper social distance requirements. They have been putting a much

needed fresh coat of paint on the main and lower level corridors. They are working on the landscaping and did a spring clean-up of the leaves and winter debris.

Pat has been working on prepping and painting the exterior side of the wooden Heritage Hall doors that are on "B" street. You should drive by when you are out to see the work in progress!


