Pastor's Message

I recently read an article on the Washington Post entitled "Here's why deep down we like rewatching the same old movies and shows — especially during the pandemic."

One of the interviewees in the article stated this: "It's comforting...These are reliable things, where you can flash back to a happier, simpler time in your life."

I'll be honest: I'm one who watches the same television series over and over again. Most of the time, I have the show playing when I'm doing household chores. The familiarity of the characters and storylines brings a sense of comfort in a chaotic, messy world. Whether it's Parks and Recreation, Grey's Anatomy, or Friends (which I'm currently rewatching), viewing these shows again and again is as soothing as a cup of tea and pair of cozy socks.

Staying in my comfort zone rewatching television shows and movies for the billionth time is very easy. But then I became familiar with Twins the New Trend, two young men in their early twenties who record themselves reacting to songs from the past few decades as they hear them for the first time.

These are songs that many of us would find familiar. From Dolly Parton to Earth, Wind, and Fire, the guys give each song their due. They were brought up in a household whose religious tradition restricted them from popular culture; much of what we have all experienced is new to them. The excitement in their eyes when they hear a new-to-them song is refreshing. They nearly leaped out of their seats when they first heard the drum riff in the song "In the Air Tonight" by Phil Collins.

No matter the style of music - from country to pop to R&B to classical, these two young men always find the positive in the music. They are always going outside of their comfort zones and what they know to experience something new.

I think many of us tend to lean towards the familiar if given a choice. We tend to go back to the same stories we know in scripture instead of heading to a book of the Bible that we don't know as well. Instead of heading to one of our comfort books of the Bible (like Mark or Romans or Psalms, for instance), what if we decided to read something less familiar? Might it be time for us to re-read (or read for the first time) a book in the Bible like Obadiah or Amos? What about a book like Zephaniah or Zechariah?

Mixing the familiar with the non-familiar gives us both a sense of comfort with nudging to grow. What books, scriptures, movies, songs, television shows, etc. brings you comfort during uneasy times? What books, scriptures, movies, songs, television shows, etc. is new to you and may nudge you outside of your comfort zone during this season of Lent?




