Pastor's Message - Anniversaries

Recently, I was talking with our Archivist Roger Henke about the actual St. Paul start date anniversary. We were looking through some items online, and this was something we found on our website under the information for Rev. Johann Jacob Riess:

"On March 17, 1839, Riess preached and held communion for a public crowd at the County Court House in Belleville. Later that day, a group of Protestant German families, who attended the service, called him to be their pastor. He held the first congregational meeting of his church that day. He asked that a name should be chosen for the new church. Mr. Adolph Hildebrant, newly elected president of the congregation, spoke in reply, "... remembering that our troubled exodus really had its beginning in that political meeting at St. Paul's Church of Frankfurt on the Main; remembering all that, I say there can be only one name given to our new church... St. Paul's Church..."

In a spirit of joy for the future and remembering the trials of the past, we will remember the beginning of St. Paul around March 17, 2023.

In each of our lives, remembering the anniversary of various dates can be blessings, bring us much joy, prompt grief, and lend us bittersweet feelings about the past. When our wedding anniversaries or the anniversary of a birth rolls around, there is often much celebration. There are dates in our lives we remember with fond feelings—even if the people associated with those times are no longer part of our lives. And when the anniversary of a loss rolls around, we hold this close to our hearts.

I often like to celebrate the small anniversaries as well. When I go into Facebook memories, I check out the time I got together with a friend 10 or 12 years ago or the trip I took with Aaron 5 or 6 years ago. With a joy in my heart, I'll repost the memory to share with others—especially the people who were part of the day.

And as all of us know, we are never alone on anniversaries. Not only is God with us, but we are here for one another. Even when family may not be around, we are gifted with friends from many years ago or ones we met in the past decade.

When there is an anniversary of a significant loss in your lives, know that we are here if you need. When there is an anniversary of a memorable day, we are here to celebrate with you. (And don't forget to check out the birthdays and anniversaries on page 14 and send messages to our friends on these special days.)

The people of St. Paul have been around for 183 1/2 years through joys and sorrows, through ordinary days and memorable moments. And we will honor our 184th anniversary in March 2023. For all of this, I share my gratitude!
