Pastor's Message - Appreciating Creation

My husband Aaron has a goal in his life to travel to each US national park and monument during his lifetime. So far, he has been to over 179 National Park sites (31 of them are National Parks). While there are a few remote ones he assumes he will not travel to, he is always planning trips to see the beauty of God's creation.

When we were planning our Alaskan cruise, we decided to travel to Glacier Bay National Park and the town of Sitka.

There are not enough words in our language for me to describe Glacier Bay! The snow capped mountains, clear waters, majestic glaciers, and local animals were a gift to embrace. There was just not enough time to spend reflecting on the magnitude of God's artistry while gazing upon the surroundings. I couldn't believe I was on the same planet as the lower 48. These moments were filled with holiness!

In Sitka, we walked to the Sitka National Historic Park which held some ornate totems. Each one told stories of the Tlingit and Haida people. While we were in the park, we noticed a soar of bald eagles. Through the stories of the Indigenous people, the surrounding mountains and volcanoes surrounding Sitka, and the company of the nearby bald eagles, we noticed the sacredness of the space and how God's creation is not to be taken for granted.

And this made me reflect on the following: How is it that we are caring for creation so as not to speed up the melting of our glaciers which will throw off the balance of creation? How are we recognizing the stories of our country's Indigenous ancestors and the pain they went through?

I know many people - including the UCC this month at General Synod - are now starting meetings and other events with a land acknowledgement of the traditional territory of the Indigenous people who were settled on the particular land. For instance we are on land once Osage, O-ga-xpa Ma-zhoⁿ (O-ga-xpa), Quapaw, Myaamia, Očhéthi Šakówiŋ, Kaskaskia, and Kiikaapoi (Kickapoo). Recognizing treaties made with them and the history of the land as well as their stories can be part of this land acknowledgement.

We are always asking ourselves how we can better creation. Caring for our gardens, recycling our bottles, and supporting local farms can be a start. Having conversations about the history of our country - recognizing our heritage and recognizing the ways others have experienced oppression is crucial to the well being of our country and entire world. These are more ways that we can share kindness and be the light in our world.

I give much gratitude to our lay leaders in this congregation who are planning our July 2 worship service as they give thanks to God for the beauty of our country including special places like national parks and recognize the wisdom of Native Americans leaders. May we continue to celebrate the beauty of our country and world and seek new ways to care for one another. And let us pray for rain so our farmer's crops can grow and so the northern wildfires will cease!

Thinking about Pentecost

Since Pentecost Sunday, May 26, we are now in the longest season of the liturgical calendar which lasts until advent. With Pentecost being about the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Christian church, it got me thinking about the Holy Spirit at our church. As church council president this year, I have attended at least one meeting of most of the teams/boards at St. Paul. This experience has left me very impressed with the members of our church. The level of care, dedication, and expertise exhibited has me feeling that the Holy Spirit is very alive and active among us. It is also gratifying to see that the average attendance at worship services has gone up in recent months. Through the grace of God and the talents and wisdom of many people through the years, the radio and streaming mediums enabled us to receive the worship services outside the walls of the church. This has been quite a blessing, especially during the dark days of the COVID pandemic. However, I personally find it very wonderful to be in God's house worshipping and fellowshipping with my friends and Christian neighbors, and I hope all who are able will come be a part of worship services. As the old saying goes "the more the merrier." But even better than that, more people worshipping together will make our services more vibrant than they already are, and I think they are pretty good right now. Also, it's good to remember Jesus' words in Matthew 18:20 "For where two or more gather in my name, there am I with them." So my hope and prayer is that we will always stay open to the Holy Spirit's guidance so that we may be a loving and caring Christian church that will thrive long into the future.
